

WHEREAS, HOSA promotes the development of responsible citizenship, personal integrity, and compassion for humanity.



Officer Coleman received recognition last night at the MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) Annual DUI Enforcement Awards Banquet for his exceptional work in the detection, apprehension and investigation of impaired drivers. Officer Coleman received the MADD DUI enforcement award.

Tyron (Ty) Coleman has worked as a police officer for the Coolidge Police Department since August 2007. Officer Coleman has always been full of energy and very proactive, especially in the detection and apprehension of impaired drivers. Since January 1, 2011, Ty has had a total of 14 DUI arrests.

Ty is a certified HGN officer and he is always ready to lend assistance to other officers who are not certified HGN. Ty is a skilled officer who shares his knowledge of indicators of impaired drivers. He often assists other officers wanting to better their techniques when working with impaired drivers.

In addition, Officer Coleman writes high-quality reports and articulates his facts and observations well, which leads to solid DUI cases and more prosecutions. Ty has also been active in the enforcement of underage drinking laws and underage sales.

While Ty is persistent with his work duties, he also conducts himself with the utmost professionalism during every contact and arrest. Ty continues to be active within the community by participating in local community events. He also assists with the Impaired Drivers Simulator.

SUBJECT: Highway Safety Improvement Program Fund Application for School Zone Signing and Striping	STAFF PRESENTER: Susanna R. Struble, Director of Public Works

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend that the City Council approve the application for Highway Safety Improvement Program funds to perform a school zone analysis, an environmental clearance, and the purchase and installation of signs and striping improvements; authorizing the Public Works staff to prepare the necessary documents for submittal.

DISCUSSION:

The Central Arizona Association of Governments receives annually \$600,000 in funds for projects which provide for safety improvements on roadways within the region. The City of Coolidge has recently entered into two agreements with ADOT for these funds to support upgrades to signing and striping within the community for a total of \$270,000. We have also received approval to receive an additional \$74,200 worth of funds for the replacement of street and stop signs in the six square mile core of the community. All three of these projects are 100% funded through the HSIP program.

CAAG has remaining HSIP funds and is currently requesting project applications for the remaining HSIP funds over the next three years. The current application for projects is due on October 28th, 2011, to be considered by the TTAC and ultimately approved by the CAAG regional council. In discussion with City Management, Police Chief, and Growth Management, the next immediate identified need for safety projects eligible for funding under this program would include the upgrade of signing and striping within our school zone areas.

Project elements will include review of each school area to identify the appropriate school zone area and the installation of necessary safety improvements and environmental clearance of proposed sites. Anticipated infrastructure improvements include upgrades to signing with flashing beacons on speed limit signs, lighted crosswalk signs and striping to meet the Manual of Traffic Control Devices and Arizona State Statutes. All schools within the community will be analyzed and improvements made as necessary to meet the recommendations of the analysis.

Funding for this project will be requested over two years 2012/13 to include the analysis and environmental clearance and 2013/14 for installation of improvements. Funding for this type of improvement requires a 5.7% match in funds by the community. Project costs are estimated as follows:





Aerial Map of Street Sign Locations


