Open to the Public by Appointment Only

Thank you for your patience during this pandemic. Library staff is hard at work making the library a safe place for everyone.

Due to CDC recommendations, the library is open limited hours: Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. closed Saturday and Sunday. In-Library services are available by appointment only. No-Contact Curbside Pickup by Appointment Only

Patrons can place items on hold by phone at (520) 723-6034, online at pinalcountyaz.gov/library, or on the PCLD app. Once you receive notification that your items are ready for pickup, select a pickup time at <https://bit.ly/CoolLibraryAppt> Parking spots will be located between the library handicapped spaces and Main St, marked by cones.

What procedures are practiced inside the library?

All staff members will wear fresh gloves and masks when handling library materials or assisting patrons inside the library or at curbside pickup. Other practices include but are not limited to:

- Per Mayor Thompson's proclamation, patrons must wear a mask while inside the library.
- Patrons are asked to maintain 6 feet of social distancing. Signs are placed on the floor to signify 6 feet of social distancing while waiting to check out materials.
- All items are quarantined for 72 hours before being checked in, handled, or shelved.
- All patron computers, desks, and chairs are cleaned between uses.
- Library visits are limited to no more than 12 patrons at a time including children. Reservations can be made for 30 minutes to browse or 60 minutes to use a computer.
- Maximum time permitted in the library is one hour per day.
- No copy or fax service is available until further notice.
- The study room is closed until further notice.
- All library programs are offered virtually.


Join the reading program:





Early Childhood Tips from First Things First

Strong social connections key to supporting families

It's important that parents and caregivers have positive connections in their community to help them face the challenges of parenting. During these times of social distancing, FTF, along with community partners remind families that there are ways to reach out and find places to make these social connections - for example, within local communities of faith, online support groups, and local health providers. Social connections that provide emotional support to parents is one of five protective factors that families are encouraged to develop as a way to mitigate or eliminate stress more effectively. The other four are parenting skills, concrete support through meeting basic economic needs like food and shelter, resilience (ability to manage and bounce back from challenges), and social and emotional competence in children.

"Having someone to reach out to is important when you're stressed and searching for support," said Sandy LaCava, Community Development Manager at Southwest Human Development, which runs the Birth to Five Helpline, a statewide helpline that is partially funded by FTF.

The helpline is a free service for all Arizona parents or caregivers to call, text, or email with questions about their young child's development. The helpline can also offer families connections to local resources and supports. The Birth to Five Helpline is available at 1-877-705-KIDS (5437) from Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. You can also leave a voicemail, submit your question online, or text the Helpline 24 hours a day seven days a week. You can also download the Birth to Five app for your phone through the Apple App Store or Google Play.

"It's an opportunity to enhance that support." LaCava said.






DESIGN & DASH TO-GO





The Women of Airforce Service Pilots of WWII
