### **Open to the Public by Appointment Only**

Thank you for your patience during this pandemic. Library staff is hard at work making the library a safe place for everyone.

Due CDC recommendations, the library will be open with limited hours: Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. closed Saturday and Sunday. In-Library services are available by appointment only. You can register for an appointment by calling (520) 723-6030 or online at <https://bit.ly/CoolLibraryAppt>. No fax or copy services are available at this time. Thank you for understanding. If you have any questions please feel free to call (520) 723-6030.

### **No-Contact Curbside Pickup by Appointment Only**

Patrons can place items on hold by phone at (520) 723-6034, online at [pinalcountyaz.gov/library](http://pinalcountyaz.gov/library), or on the PCLD app. Once you receive notification that your items are ready for pickup, select a pickup time at <https://bit.ly/CoolLibraryAppt> Parking spots will be located between the library handicapped spaces and Main St, marked by cones.

Monday, Wednesday, & Friday - 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.  
Tuesday & Thursday - 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.  
Monday through Friday - 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Don't forget to bring your cell phone and library card so we can verify your account. Once you have arrived for your pick up time, please open the trunk of your vehicle so items can be placed there without contact.

### **Currently Not Accepting Donations until further notice**

Thank you for thinking of the library when you donate your books. However, in a desire to maintain a safe environment for both patrons and staff the library cannot accept donations at this time.

When donating items in the future, please note that the library cannot accept the following: Textbooks; Encyclopedias; Reader's Digest abridged or condensed books; Books with torn pages, missing covers, or items that are written in; or Books that are grimy, musty, moldy, bug infested, or mildewed.

## What procedures are practiced inside the library?

All staff members will wear fresh gloves and masks when handling library materials or assisting patrons inside the library or at curbside pickup.

Other practices include but are not limited to:

- Patrons are encouraged to wear a mask while inside the library.
- Patrons are asked to maintain 6 feet of social distancing. Signs are placed on the floor to signify 6 feet of social distancing while waiting to check out materials.
- All items are quarantined for 72 hours before being checked in, handled, or shelved.
- All patron computers, desks, and chairs are cleaned between uses.
- Library visits are limited to no more than 12 patrons at a time including children. Reservations can be made for 30 minutes to browse or 60 minutes to use a computer.
- No copy or fax service is available until further notice.
- The study room is closed until further notice.
- All library programs are offered virtually.
- Sanitizer is available for patron and staff use.

## How do I make a Library Computer Appointment?

Library computers are available by reservation only. Reserve a separate library computer visit for each person who needs to access a computer. Only one person will be allowed on each computer. No additional seating is available for people to wait for you while you are on the computer. ## How do I make a Library Visit Appointment?

Reserve a library visit for each member of the family who will enter the library at <https://bit.ly/CoolLibraryAppt> or call (520) 723-6030. Return items in the book drop at the front of the library or the return in the alley behind the library before entering the library. Please note: items will not be checked in immediately as they will be quarantined for 72 hours. Do not be concerned if items you returned are still showing on your account for a few days. This will not affect your ability to borrow new items.



3. Make an account and enter the Reading Program Code: **81b1d** and select your age group, for bonus activities enter Program Code: **659bd**
4. Begin logging your reading today!



## DESIGN & DASH TO-GO






## Check 'em Out: Online Book Club

#### Outreach
